A stunning focal piece for any edible garden or container; thin, green leaves grow in dense rosettes; delicate and buttery flavor, it is great for baby green salads or wraps; compact habit with a very good bolt resistance

Edible Qualities

Salanova Green Butter Lettuce is an annual vegetable plant that is commonly grown for its edible qualities. The oval light green leaves with hints of green are usually harvested from mid spring to early fall. The leaves have a pleasant taste and a crunchy texture.

- Fresh Eating
- Eating When Cooked/Prepared

Planting & Growing

Salanova Green Butter Lettuce will grow to be about 10 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 8 inches. When planted in rows, individual plants should be spaced approximately 8 inches apart. This vegetable plant is an annual, which means that it will grow for one season in your garden and then die after producing a crop. Because of its relatively short time to maturity, it lends itself to a series of successive plantings each staggered by a week or two; this will prolong the effective harvest period.

This plant is typically grown in a designated vegetable garden. It does best in full sun to partial shade. It does best in average conditions that are neither too wet nor too dry, and is very intolerant of standing water. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in rich soils. It is quite intolerant of urban pollution, therefore inner city or urban streetside plantings are best avoided. This is a selected variety of a species not originally from North America.; however, as a cultivated variety, be aware that it may be subject to certain restrictions or prohibitions on propagation.

Salanova Green Butter Lettuce is a good choice for the vegetable garden, but it is also well-suited for use in outdoor pots and containers. It is often used as a 'filler' in the 'spiller-thriller-filler' container combination, providing the canvas against which the thriller plants stand out. Note that when growing plants in outdoor containers and baskets, they may require more frequent waterings than they would in the yard or garden.
